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SUBJECT: Reconciliation Process, Political Relationship

ALOHA Kakou,

My name is Richard Pomaikaiokalani Kinney. I am of Hawaiian, Portuguese, Irish, Scotch, English and Tahitian ancestry.

I was born on December 26, 1938 at Queen's Hospital.

On January 17, 1993, I renounced my citizenship to the United States.

I have devoted 40 years of my adult life to the research and education of Native Hawaiian rights.

I speak as SOVEREIGN of the Hawaiian Political Action Council of Hawaii. HPACH is one of the many and smallest independent Hawaiian entities seeking the independence of Hawaii. An unconditional independence from the United States.

I consider myself to be a Hawaiian Patriot. One who will always be willing to place myself on the arrest line as in the past in the protection of Native Hawaiian rights.

I have burned the flag of the United States six times. Protesting the unlawful occupation of Hawaii by the military forces of the United States.

On December 18, 1893, President Grover Cleveland issued a message to the Congress of the United States.

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On November 23, 1993, President William Clinton signed Public Law 103-150.

Both presidents and documents acknowledging the unlawful overthrow of the Hawaiian Kingdom. An "Act of War" committed with the involvement's of the military and diplomatic representatives of the United States. Violating all treaties that existed between the United States and the Kingdom of Hawaii.

You are here today as representatives of an International Thief. An International Thief who has unlawfully occupied Native Hawaiian National Lands with your military forces to make sure that Hawaii will continuously remain forever under American Sovereignty.

January 17, 2000 at 6 P.M. will be the 107 anniversary of the "Day of Infamy" for Native Hawaiians.

On that day in 1893, Queen Liliuokalani yielded her constitutional authority to the superior force of the United States. Avoiding any collision of armed forces and perhaps the loss of life. Seeking that United States would undo the actions of its representatives on January 17, 1893.

April 30, 2000 will be the 100 anniversary of the passage of the Organic Act. Another unlawful act passed by Congress. An unlawful act that alienated the Crown Lands of Hawaii. To be free and clear from all trust obligations to Native Hawaiians.

Under the Hawaiian Kingdom, the Crown Lands were not part of the public lands of the nation. These lands were special trust lands administrated by the Sovereign to benefit the

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indigenous native people of the Hawaiian nation.

These lands were protected by Kingdom law to prevent them from falling into foreign property in case of an overthrow of the Hawaiian Kingdom.

Pearl Harbor is Crown Lands. Large portions of lands in Waikiki are Crown Lands. Native Hawaiian National Lands that Queen Liliuokalani, her people of that time and of today, never relinquished our Inherent Sovereignty.

After World War II, United States protected the Inherent Sovereign right of the people of Germany and Japan. Today, Germany and Japan are Free, Sovereign and Independent nations, ruled by its people. Today, there is an Emperor of Japan.

What did Queen Liliuokalani do wrong to lose her Constitutional right to be Sovereign of the Hawaiian Islands? What did Native Hawaiians do so wrong to have their country stolen from them?

Was it wrong that Queen Liliuokalani did not react to the Act of War? Was it wrong for Queen Liliuokalani and Princess Kaiulani to address Congress, protesting the annexation of their country? Was is wrong that as a Christian, Queen Liliuokalani believed in American Justice?

Is it wrong for I and many Native Hawaiians today to seek the revival of our country? Tell me, what did Queen Liliuokalani and her children's children do so wrong to deserve the lost of our country?

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It is time, that the United States honor its apology to Native Hawaiians. It is time, that the flag of the United States be removed from all governmental buildings. Allowing Native Hawaiians the freedom to truly gather in a national convention. A national convention without any and all involvement of the United States and its governmental agencies.

UA MAU KE EA O KA AINA I KA PONO speaks of Hawaiian Sovereignty as being righteous.

American Sovereignty belongs on the continent and not in Hawaii. You have over extended the ALOHA of our people and your stay. Now is the time that you should go home and leave us in peace.

The Hawaiian Kingdom was and never will be a military threat to the sovereignty of the United States.

The Inherent Sovereignty of the National Lands of my ancestors are not, "For Sale".
