SIR: I have the honor to submit herewith statements of the receipts and disbursements of the Government during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1920, as follows:

In the gold-reserve fund there were redemptions of \$3,585,390 United States notes. As the notes were at once exchanged for gold in the general fund, the reserve was maintained at the sum fixed by law, which, increased by the sum of \$2,979,025.63 tax on additional circulation under act of May 30, 1908, amounted on June 30, 1920, to the sum of \$152,979,025.63.

In the trust funds, reserved against gold and silver certificates and Treasury notes of 1890, there were \$78,182,000 of certificates issued and \$332,579,700 of certificates and Treasury notes of 1890 redeemed, resulting in an excess of \$254,397,700 in the redemptions during the year, and a decrease in the funds to \$704,637,755 on June 30, 1920, exclusive of certificates and notes in the Treasury.

The postal revenue receipts amounted to \$437,150,212.33 and the expenditures therefrom for the Postal Service were \$418,722,295.05 (exclusive of \$35,698,400 for "Additional Compensation, Postal Service," paid from the Treasury), an excess of receipts of \$18,427,917.28.
