³ Under the act of June 25, 1910 (36 Stat. 835), \$20,000,000 was advanced to the "Reclamation fund" from the general fund of the Treasury, \$10,000,000 of which has been returned on the "Reclamation fund" under the provisions of the act of June 12, 1917 (40 Stat. 149), which provided for the return of \$1,000,000 annually. The act of Feb. 6, 1931 (46 Stat. 1069), suspended this reimbursement of \$1,000,000 annually for a period of 2 years, beginning with the fiscal year ending June 30, 1931, hence no reimbursement was made to the general fund during the fiscal years 1931 and 1932. Under the act of Mar. 3, 1931 (46 Stat. 1507), \$5,000,000 additional was advanced from the general fund of the Treasury to the appropriation "Advances to the reclamation fund, reimbursable," to be returned to the general fund of the Treasury from the reclamation fund at the rate of \$1,000,000 annually beginning July 1, 1933. Sec. 10 of the act of Apr. 1, 1932 (47 Stat. 78), suspends this reimbursement to the general fund until July 1, 1934. Sec. 2 of the act of Mar. 3, 1933 (47 Stat. 1427) suspends reimbursement until July 1, 1936, and the act of June 22, 1936 (49 Stat. 1734), until July 1, 1938.
