Hoonah Salmon Survey

This report describes the contemporary subsistence sockeye salmon harvest and use by the Tlingit of Hoonah, Alaska at Hoktaheen Cove and Neva River, Excursion Inlet. Topics include local ecological knowledge of the sockeye salmon runs in these areas, harvest patterns, issues of competition, distribution of salmon, continuity of traditional practices, and related trends. Local and traditional ecological knowledge was collected through interviews with Tlingit key respondents who reside in Hoonah and actively participate in the fisheries. Observation of the fisheries also provided information on which the report is based. i
