


WHY WORLD HERITAGE CONVENTION?

- Palau became full-fledge Member State of UNESCO on October 22, 1999
- Palau National Commission was created through Executive Order No. 175 on March 10, 2000
- Ratified the 1972 World Heritage Convention in 2000
- Members of Palau National Commission:
 - Chair Minister of Community and Cultural Affairs
 - Secretary General Director of Education
 - Members Minister of Education, Minister of Natural Resources, Environment, and Tourism, Minister of State, Director, Bureau of International Trade & Technical Assistance, Director, Bureau of Cultural & Historical Preservation, Director, Bureau of Environment, CEO of Palau International Coral Reef Center, and Koror State Government.

OUTSTANDING UNIVERSAL VALUE (OUV)



WORLD HERITAGE CRITERIA SELECTION FOR RISL

• Cultural criteria:

- I. Masterpieces of human creative genius
- II. Monumental arts, technology, townplanning or landscape design
- III. Exceptional testimony to a cultural tradition or civilization
- IV. Building, architectural, or technological ensemble of significant stage in history
- V. Traditional human settlement, landuse or sea-use, representing human interactions with the environment
- VI. Artistic and literary works

- Natural criteria :
- VII. Natural phenomena or exceptional beauty
- VIII. Significant geological processes
- IX. On-going ecological & biological processes
- X. In-situ conservation of biodiversity, threatened species




