I am an avid backcountry skier, subsistence hunter, I work with search and rescue dogs, and am a volunteer EMT with Cooper Landing emergency services. I would have to say most everyone in the community want threes proposals to pass. We have a few people who have been against it and they don't want to work with the community to get balance with what the town wants. More people recreate in these areas than trap. Recreation brings more people to Cooper Landing than trapping does. The local economy depends more on recreation than the trapping.
