The Native American Fish & Wildlife Society is a national Tribal non-profit, whose purpose is to assist Native American and Alaska Native Tribes with the conservation, protection, and enhancement of their fish and wildlife resources.

Proposed Workshop:

The Native American Fish & Wildlife Society is proposing to hold a beaver workshop in the Northwest Arctic and would like to work with local partners to connect with potential attendees and organize the event.

This event will be a 2-3 day workshop focused on beaver ecology, water quality, and their ecological impacts, specifically designed for tribal wildlife staff. The dates for this workshop are flexible. Targeting 10-15 participants, the workshop will feature presentations, hands-on training, and discussions aimed at building the capacity of tribal nations to manage beaver-related issues on their lands, in partnership with the Arctic Beaver Observation Network and local beaver project partners. The agenda is still being decided, so any input from RAC members is welcomed.
