ORDER NO. 3237, Amendment No. 11 (*Amended material bold and italicized*)

Subject: Delegation of the Secretary's Authority in Emergencies

Sec. 1 Purpose. The purpose of this Order is to delegate to the named members of the Interior Crisis Action Team (Team) the full delegable authority of the Secretary so the members of the Team or any one of them, as appropriate, may exercise that authority when necessary.

Sec. 2 Authority. The authority for this Order is Reorganization Plan Number 3 of 1950, as amended (64 Stat. 1262), 5 U.S.C. app.

Sec. 3 Delegation.

a. Subject to conditions set forth herein, all of the authorities of the Secretary of the Interior are hereby delegated to the following members of the Team: **Gregory Gould**, Kim Thorsen, Laurence I. Broun, Willie Taylor, Edward T. Keable, **David Murillo**, Estle Lewis-McBride, LeaAnne Thorne, Brad Laubach, and **Staci King**. These authorities may be exercised by members of the Team only while they are actively serving as members of the Team and employees of the Department. These authorities may not be re-delegated.

b. The authorities delegated by this Order are to be exercised only in the case of and for the duration of emergencies and only in cases where neither the Secretary nor any duly designated successor to the Secretary is available or able to perform the duties of that Office. These authorities may be exercised by the members of the Team named in Sec. 3a. above, as they are available and able and in the order in which they are listed until such time as the Secretary, acting Secretary, or official with delegated authority as designated in 302 DM 3.1B is available to exercise such authorities.

c. To the extent that there are authorities of the Secretary that by law or regulation may not be re-delegated to the named members of the Team, such limitations will be identified in the Departmental Manual.

Sec. 4 Expiration Date. This Order is effective immediately. It shall remain in effect until its provisions are amended, superseded, or revoked, whichever occurs first. In the absence of any of the foregoing actions, this Order shall terminate and become obsolete on **October 1, 2013**. The termination of this Order will not nullify the delegations effected herein.
