Subject: Department of the Interior Wildland Fire Boot Stipend (Amendment)

Purpose: The purpose of this Policy Memorandum (PM) is to provide Departmental guidance on the increase for the yearly stipend provided to employees for wildland fire boots. This PM amends the June 17, 2021 version of Office of Wildland Fire (OWF) PM 2021-004, "Department of the Interior Wildland Fire Boot Stipend. This PM changes the period of the stipend from fiscal year to calendar year.

Scope: This PM applies to the Department of the Interior's (DOI) bureaus and offices participating in Wildland Fire Management (WFM) activities.

Timeframe: This PM is effective immediately and remains in effect until rescinded or modified.

Background: In 2011, OWF Coordination Policy 2011-2 Wildland Fire Boot Stipend was issued. It allowed a \$100.00 stipend per calendar year to qualified firefighters. The cost to repair or purchase appropriate boots has increased over the past ten years.

The National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) establishes wildland fire standards for use by the bureaus, and the NWCG Wildland Fire Boot standard has been adopted by each bureau as appropriate for safe work on the fireline.

The DOI WFM bureaus have concluded that protective footwear is considered non-specialized personal protective equipment, is personal in nature, and can be used by employees off the job site. Therefore, appropriate boots are a condition of employment for firefighting positions, and boots must be purchased by the employee prior to employment.

Coordination: Subject matter experts, Bureau Operations Specialists, and Fire Directors were consulted in the development of this PM.

Existing Policy Affected: This PM replaces OWF PM 2011-2, "Department of the Interior Wildland Fire Boot Stipend," dated October 14, 2011.

Authority: Authority under Departmental Manual 112 DM 7.

Policy: DOI authorizes payment of a \$167.00 stipend per calendar year to employees holding a valid¹ Incident Qualification Card with a fitness rating of moderate or arduous, and who, as a condition of employment, are required to purchase boots that satisfy the NWCG Wildland Fire Boot Standard.

Personnel hired under the Administratively Determined (AD) hiring authority who qualify may receive the stipend at the time of payment following their first fire assignment in an Incident Qualification and Certification System (IQCS)-qualified position requiring a moderate or arduous fitness rating in each calendar year.

DOI bureaus and offices will follow established payment processes to track and disburse stipends. For all qualified employees, AD employees, or non-fire bureaus that have an incident response (fire suppression) agreement with OWF, payment of the stipend should be charged to the appropriate sub-activity (e.g., Preparedness, Fuels Management, or Suppression).

Employees who have already applied or received the yearly boot stipend are encouraged to make another claim to be paid the full stipend amount for this calendar year.
