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WRANGELL-ST. ELIAS NATIONAL PARK AND PRESERVE WILDLIFE REPORT

Fall 2021

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Chisana Caribou Herd

The Yukon Department of Environment deployed 10 GPS/Iridium and 15 VHF radiocollars, February 17-19, 2021. Fifty-one radiocollars (21 GSP/Iridium, 30 VHF) have been deployed in the herd in 2020-2021. The Chisana caribou herd working group plans to conduct a population census of the herd in October 2021.

Mentasta Caribou Herd

WRST and ADF&G completed the Mentasta caribou post-calving census on June 23, 2021. We counted 276 total caribou during the census compared to 405 caribou in 2020, and 249 caribou in 2019. The higher numbers observed in 2020 are likely due in part to Nelchina caribou returning late from their winter range that year. Some of these late returning caribou may have failed to migrate back to their traditional calving grounds, remaining in WRST. This theory is supported by the presence of 3 radiocollared Nelchina caribou in the Mentasta caribou calving/summer range in 2020. Additionally, small groups of caribou could have moved in from other areas such as the Tonsina Controlled Use Area.

A sightability model, based on the number of radiocollared caribou missed during the current and previous surveys is used to derive the estimated number of June cows (Table 1). We use the fall calf:cow and bull:cow ratios relative to the estimated number of June cows to determine the estimated fall calves and bulls. The observed number of caribou during the fall composition count is presented in Table 2. Caution should be used when interpreting the 2020 Mentasta population estimate, particularly to alter caribou harvest regulations in GMU 11. We should determine whether this is a one year phenomenon or part of a longer term trend. We plan to re-deploy 6 GPS/Iridium collars that were recovered and refurbished from caribou mortalities. 2021 results will be presented at the fall SRC meeting.

Dall Sheep




Figure 1. Dall sheep count areas, Wrangell-St. Elias National Park and Preserve, Alaska.

WRST conducted minimum count Dall sheep surveys in Count Areas (CA) 10 and 14 in GMU 11 during July 2021 (Figure 1). CA's 10 and 14 were last surveyed in 2002 and 2013, respectively (Table 3). The total number of sheep in CA 14 (Crystalline Hills) has increased since 1994 and is similar to surveys conducted from 1973-1993 averaging 157 sheep. Although there were few surveys, sheep in CA 10 appear to be increasing from low counts conducted in 2001 and 2002.
