<u>Purpose:</u> This Policy Memorandum (PM) provides guidance on the Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 third-quarter review of budget execution status for the Department of the Interior's (DOI) Wildland Fire Management (WFM) program. This policy applies to all activities funded by the WFM appropriation, except for Suppression Operations.

Background: The Office of Wildland Fire (OWF) is coordinating this review in order to formulate an objective assessment of the current status of budget execution in the WFM program and anticipate the impacts that the COVID-19 pandemic may have on program performance.

By taking a proactive approach to evaluating the progress of current activities, OWF and the DOI fire bureaus are committing to effective oversight and management of the WFM program in support of the Secretary's and Administration's priorities.

<u>Coordination</u>: Bureau Fire Directors and Fire Budget Leads were consulted in the development of this PM.

Scope: This PM applies to the Department of the Interior's bureaus and offices responsible for wildland fire management activities.
