Subject: Airtanker Base Frequency Change 2015

Area of Concern: All Aviation Users

ISSUE: The FAA manages all aviation Air-to-Air AM frequencies for all Airtanker Bases and 123.975 MHz is usually assigned for this purpose. Occasionally, this frequency may not be available at a given location. In this case, the FAA will provide an alternative frequency in the 118-136 MHz band that can be nominated for assignment by NTIA. *Due to engineering restrictions there are new frequency assignments/changes to the National Airtanker Bases frequencies for fire season 2015.* While most bases retain 123.975 as the RAMP frequency, notable changes are highlighted in red and are effective immediately.
