ONRR needed a digital resource to facilitate national and international conversation around U.S. extractive industries revenue in support of the U.S.'s implementation of EITI


What is 18F doing?


Designing and developing a data portal featuring curated content, raw data, and interactive infographics that can be readily understood and accessed by the public for reuse through other media and applications




Oil. Crude oil is produced in 31 states and U.S. coastal waters. In 2012, 61% of U.S. crude oil production came from five states...[more](#)→
