- June 15 - July 15 is when Canada geese molt and preferred time to capture.
- USDA APHIS Wildlife Services provides Federal leadership and expertise to resolve wildlife conflicts to allow people and wildlife to coexist.
- On **June 15**, USDA Wildlife Services/APHIS will submit 2 permit applications to Gateway National Recreation Area:
 - **Permit 1.** To begin removing 200 Canada geese on the landfill area that is currently being capped. The landfill is in the park but is currently managed by the city of New York. NPS can process and issue this permit pretty quickly. Removal of the 200 Canada geese is planned to occur between June 25 through June 29, 2012
 - **Permit 2.** The second permit is for the removal of 1,000 Canada geese at Jamaica Bay’s Ruler's Bar. This permit cannot be issued until the FEIS – ROD is signed on July 1, 2012. (FEIS was issued in May 11, 2012.)A permit can then be issued thereafter. USDA Wildlife Service expects to begin removing the geese between July 7 and July 10th.
- FWS has **talking points** that can be used for media inquiries.
