

## Department of the Interior Sustainable Building Assessment and Compliance Strategy, Phase 1 Resource Guide

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### Definitions and Resources

- As Sustainable as Possible (ASAP) building – A Department of the Interior owned building larger than 5,000 gross square feet, generally unoccupied, unheated, uncooled, and unplumbed for which many Guiding Principles are not applicable and reported as met. The remaining applicable guiding principles for that building must be in compliance and reported as met.
- Minimal environmental impact building – buildings that are unoccupied and have minimal energy and/or water use. These buildings may be considered Guiding Principle compliant with little or no modifications, and any change would not provide substantial environmental improvement or cost savings.
- Federal Real Property Profile (FRPP) – the GSA inventory system that contains data on all federal real property assets.
