

BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT

- Largest U.S. public landholdings
- Management of 248 M surface acres
- Management of 700 M subsurface acres
- Mission of multiple use and protection
 - National Landscape Conservation Areas 32.4 M ac
 - Recreation (established sites): 32 M visitor days/yr
 - Recreation (dispersed sites): 29 M visitor days/yr
 - Wilderness Areas 4.8 M ac
 - National Monuments 8.7 M ac





BLM - HISTORICAL SNAPSHOT

Colonial Origins

- Land Ordinance of 1785 the new country's lands
- Land Laws of 1796, 1800, 1804 surveys and sales
- General Land Office 1812 administration of sales
- Homestead Act of 1862 settle on free land
- General Mining Law of 1872 mining rights
- Desert Land Law of 1877 improve w irrigation
- Public Lands Reform Law of 1891 conservation
- Taylor Grazing Act of 1934 grazing administration

Federal Land Policy and Management Act -


"organic act" that establishes the agency's multiple-use mandate to serve present and future generations.



BLM & ENERGY MANAGEMENT

In 2010, on-shore Oil & Gas:

- 51,000 O&G leases
- 41 Million acres leased for O&G
- 12 Million acres in O&G production
- 120 Million barrels oil produced
- 3 Trillion cubic feet natural gas produced
- Yielded \$40 Billion worth of energy & minerals.
- Boosted the American economy by \$103 Billion
- \$4.3 Billion in revenue from royalties and fees





BLM COASTAL MANAGEMENT

Coastal Holdings:

- California (Coastal Nat'l Monument and other lands) - 1100 miles
- Oregon/Washington 20 miles; 900 acres,lighthouses
- Alaska (Nat'l Petroleum Preserve) 350 miles
- Gulf of Mexico approx. 600 acres, lighthouse
- Assertive Representation of Resource Interests
- Coordination with other Res. Mgmt. agencies
- Relationships with Communities & Organizations



- More than 20,000 rocks & small islands
- Spread along California's 1,100 miles of coastline
- Encompassed within a 14,600 square nautical mile area (CCNM Corridor)
- · Totaling only about 1,000 acres
- · All off-shore (no on-shore portion)
- · Cuts across 5 BLM Field Offices
- Adjoins & intertwined with dozens of different jurisdictions, from one end of the California coast to the other






Figure 1-1b CCNM Relative Location of Rocks, Islands, and Pinnacles

BLM OIL SPILL MANAGEMENT CAPACITY


- Internal, field-based staff
