CONTINGENCY PLAN FACT SHEET  
APRIL 8, 2011**

We continue to hope that Congress will reach an agreement to avoid a government shutdown, but we are working to prepare for all possible scenarios. The following fact sheet provides basic information about the Office of the Inspector General's contingency plans in the event of a government shutdown.

**Services and Programs that would remain operational**

OIG will have no major services continuing	n/a
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**Services and programs that would be closed**

- All routine services provided by the OIG will be closed or discontinued; to include Recovery oversight, investigations, audits, evaluations, inspections and prevention.
- State Grant Audits will not be conducted by OIG auditors during this period as scheduled.

**Key citizen services that would be affected**

- OIG Hotline for Fraud, Waste and Mismanagement will not be staffed. Web based complaints will be received but not reviewed. Telephone or mail complaints or concerns will not be processed or reviewed.
- OIG Recovery and Contractor hotlines will not be staffed and complaints not processed.
- OIG offices will not be staffed for citizen inquiries and walk-ins.
