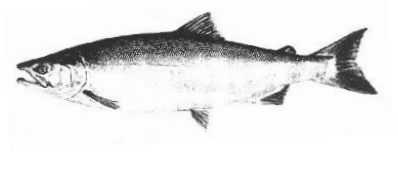

**2017 Yukon River Fall Salmon Fishery News Release # 21  
Subdistricts 5-B and 5-C Commercial Schedule**

Districts Affected: Upper Yukon Area  
Fall Season Emergency Order # 19

The 2017 fall chum salmon preseason projection is for a run size greater than 1.1 million fish. This level of abundance should be sufficient to provide for escapement, an average subsistence harvest, and a surplus available for commercial and personal use purposes.

The estimated fall chum salmon passage at the mainstem sonar near Pilot Station through August 1 is 424,500 fish, which is above the historical median of 197,100 fish for that date. The first pulse of fall chum salmon entered the Yukon River on July 17 and is expected to be arriving near the Rapids around August 6 and Rampart on August 7.

**Subdistricts 5-B and 5-C Commercial Schedule:**

Effective 6:00 p.m. Friday, August 4, commercial fishing in Subdistricts 5-B and 5-C, will be open 24 hours per day, seven days per week until further notice. Fishermen may use fish wheels or gillnets with a mesh size of 6 inches or smaller.

- Period #1: 6:00 p.m. Friday, August 4 until 12:00 p.m. Monday, August 7.
- Effective 12:00 p.m. Monday, August 7, each commercial fishing period will be 7-days and will end at 12:00 p.m. Mondays each week until further notice.

**Commercial fishermen must confirm their market prior to commercial fishing. Processors, catcher sellers, or direct marketers should notify the department of their intent to operate by contacting the Fairbanks office at 459-7274.**

The sale of Chinook salmon is prohibited. Commercial fishermen can release live Chinook salmon or use them for subsistence purposes. All fish harvested and not sold must be recorded on a fish ticket as “caught but not sold”.
