

**2016 Yukon River Fall Salmon Fishery News Release # 37  
Yukon River District 2 Commercial Period 13  
Districts Affected: Lower Yukon Area  
Emergency Order # 33**

**District 2 Commercial Fishing:**

Commercial fishing will be open for one period in District 2 on Tuesday, August 23 from 3:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. This will be a 5-hour commercial fishing period with gillnets restricted to six-inch or smaller mesh size.

Verbal reports from the District 2 commercial opening on August 21 indicate a preliminary harvest of approximately 9,440 fall chum and 3,408 coho salmon. The preliminary cumulative commercial harvest in District 2 is approximately 164,000 fall chum and 17,000 coho salmon as of August 22.

**District 2 Subsistence Fishing Schedule:**

Subsistence salmon fishing in District 2 is open during the fall season 7 days per week, 24 hours per day with gillnets restricted to a maximum mesh size of 7.5 inches, except for 12 hours before, during, and 12 hours after commercial fishing periods. In District 2, subsistence salmon fishing will close at 3:00 a.m. Tuesday, August 23, and reopen at 8:00 a.m. Wednesday, August 24. Fishermen may use 4-inch or smaller mesh size gillnets to target non-salmon species during subsistence salmon closures.
