

**2016 Yukon River Fall Salmon Fishery News Release # 6  
Yukon River District 2 Commercial Period 2**

Districts Affected: Lower Yukon Area  
Emergency Order # 6

The 2016 fall chum salmon preseason run projection, based on the summer chum to fall chum salmon run size relationship, is for a run size between 800,000 and 900,000 fish. This level of abundance should be sufficient to provide for escapement, an above average subsistence harvest, and a surplus available for commercial and personal use purposes. The estimated fall chum salmon passage at the mainstem sonar near Pilot Station through July 22 is 238,300 fish, which is above the historical median of 57,700 fish for that date. The first pulse of fall chum salmon entered the Yukon River on July 18 and should finish passing the mainstem sonar near Pilot Station by today.

**District 2 Commercial Fishing:**

Commercial fishing will be open for one period in District 2 on Sunday, July 24 from 1:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. This will be an 8-hour commercial fishing period with gillnets restricted to six-inch or smaller mesh size.

**District 2 Subsistence Fishing Schedule:**

Subsistence salmon fishing in District 2 is open during the fall season 7 days per week, 24 hours per day with gillnets restricted to a maximum mesh size of 7.5 inches, except for 12 hours before, during, and 12 hours after each commercial fishing period. In District 2, subsistence salmon fishing will close at 1:00 a.m. Sunday, July 24, and reopen at 9:00 a.m. Monday, July 25.

Fishermen may use 4-inch or smaller mesh size gillnets to target non-salmon species during subsistence salmon closures.
