George, for us to cover US Park Police posts would entail three more posts on Memorial Dr. and the GWMP. I can staff those extra posts internally. The question I have is will MPD be able to cover the Columbia Island posts on the east end of the Memorial Bridge? Specifically, eastbound Washington Blvd. at the split for Memorial Dr. and northbound GWMP at the split for Memorial Dr. starting at 0700 hours? Both of those are not in the Commonwealth of Virginia and, therefore, we have no legal authority there. Officer Jaffe, will you have the resources to handle that? If need be, I can have an Arlington Officer posted with a MPD Officer if that helps you.

Sgt. Wong, are there any other posts I'm missing on the west end of the Memorial Bridge that your personnel typically cover for ATM?

In the bigger picture, George, when is the drop dead date and time a decision will be made for a go or no go on the race? We are within two weeks of the event and there are a lot of items still being planned. Who makes that decision? Mr. Claudio? The General? Please let me know..

Greetings to all. I want to pass along the latest update which John and I received. The following was passed along by our Joint Interagency Program Director (Arnaldo "Arnie" Claudio) yesterday. The position of USPP/USPS according to Deputy Chief Robert McLean USPP. The USPP personnel by federal law during the shutdown cannot monitor the intersection for the roads that run through the NPS jurisdictions.

Now, at his suggestion this leaves open the door with proper coordination between DCMPD, ACPD, and VSP that the streets can be covered by another jurisdiction. We are looking at up on Memorial Drive, Memorial Bridge and across to 23rd Street and along Constitution Ave (23rd Street to 18th St), Rock Creek Parkway by the Kennedy Center and around to Independence Ave., and then Independence Ave up to 14th St. This could be up to 4 miles of the race route.

This option if possible would save all around in planning of trying to locate an alternate course. I for one like some excitement but at times when the dog is sleep leave it along. It might wake up hungry.

Pat - In the next few days I will have the name of the company that will cover down for VDOT. The person did speak with Mike Woods to get details and assuming they will the contract we should be good. I will keep you posted.

Dear Ms. Messinger:

As you are aware, pursuant to 36 C.F.R. § 1.5, effective at 12:01 a.m. on October 1, 2013, all units of the National Park System nationwide were closed to public visitation and use, subject to the conditions and exceptions described in the Director's October 1, 2013 Closure Determination and Notice (Closure Notice). That national closure determination was necessitated by a lapse in funds appropriated by the United States Congress for the operation of the National Park System. Under the provisions of the Antideficiency Act (Act), 31 U.S.C. s 1342, in the absence of an appropriation NPS is able to undertake only very limited activities, primarily related to emergencies which the Act explains as "the term 'emergencies involving the safety of human life or the protection of property' does not include ongoing, regular functions of government the suspension of which would not imminently threaten the safety of human life or the protection of property."

Consistent with its regulations and the terms of the applicable permits, contracts and agreements, the Closure Notice suspended all permits to ensure that a violation of the Act would not occur. With the national closure in place, there has since been a limited opportunity to examine specific issues that have arisen and determine whether modification or clarification of the national closure is lawful and appropriate. With more than 20,000 NPS employees nationwide on furlough as a result, we only became aware of the issue at Langley Forks just prior to the court's issuance of an *Ex Parte* order on October 9.

After directing the Park Authority as required by the court order yesterday, we have had our first opportunity to review this matter and have been able to determine that the Park Authority's operations under Special Use Permit NCR-GWMP-9500-12-162 (SUP) will not result in NPS

expending or obligating funds in the absence of an appropriation in violation of the Act for the duration of the shutdown. Accordingly, I have confirmed with the Director of the National Park Service that your operations under this SUP are no longer subject to suspension under the National Closure Order. You may therefore resume operations under the SUP.
