Hi All,

This will be the group I communicate with to give heads up about events that are of significance and need guidance on resolving that will likely rise to the level of the Secretary for resolution if we can't successfully manage them. If you would like me to add others, just let me know. This is in response to the Secretary wanting early notice on these types of situations.

1. Bridge Days at New River Gorge: scheduled for October 18 and 19. The event is annual and draws about 125,000 participants/spectators. They jump from the state owned bridge and land in the water or land of the NPS. Normally we would issue a permit to the group. Due to shutdown we will revoke the permit. But this group is going ahead with their activity on the planned dates and we see no way to prevent it from happening. Park/Region/NPS preferred option to deal with this is to have limited staff on hand to deal with the most serious of issues only. This would mean bringing on more law enforcement rangers than currently on duty. Normally we would have 40 staff on duty for the event. Best thinking today is trying to manage with 15. Park currently has 7 commissioned rangers on duty so we would bring on 8 additional rangers into excepted status for the duration of the event.
2. Army Ten Miler Race at National Mall and Memorial Parks: scheduled for October 20 on roadways in NAMA, GWMP and ROCR requiring permit staff and USPP for set up of road closures, siting of first aid/water stations, spectator areas. Annual event and the permit had been issued prior to shutdown and now the organizers have been notified the permit is cancelled because of shutdown. Suggested organizers find alternative route. We believe the Secretary should expect a call from a pentagon/army official to ask her assistance in reinstating their permit. NPS believes our activities for this race are not consistent with protection of life, health safety that is the focus of our work during shutdown and believe cancelling this permit is the best course of action.

Thanks in advance for your thoughts and comments so we can finalize direction to the parks.


This permit is granted subject to the following conditions:

1. Permittee and all participants authorized therein must comply with all of the conditions of this permit and with all reasonable directions of the United States Park Police.
2. All sidewalks, walkways, and roadways must remain unobstructed to allow for the reasonable use of these areas by pedestrians, vehicles and other park visitors.

PERMITTEE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR READING AND ADHERING TO THE ATTACHED ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

3. All laws, rules and regulations applicable to the area covered by this permit remain in effect.
4. No fee may be collected, donation solicited, or commercial activity conducted. No items may be sold or offered for sale except for books, newspapers, leaflets, pamphlets, buttons, and bumper stickers which contain a message related to your demonstration or special event. No other merchandise may be sold or offered for sale. A stand or structure used for the sale of permitted items may not exceed one table per site, which may be no larger than 2 ½ feet by 8 feet or 4 feet by 4 feet. The dimensions of the sales site may not exceed 6 feet wide by 15 feet long by 6 feet high.
5. The area should be left in substantially the same condition as it was prior to the activities authorized herein, and all litter shall be placed in the trash containers provided.
6. This permit is applicable only for the use of the area designated above, and during the times designated above, or in any area as may hereafter be designated by the United States Park Police.
7. The use of sound amplification equipment, other than hand-portable sound amplification equipment to be used for crowd control purposes only, is prohibited on the White House Sidewalk (South 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW., sidewalk between East Executive Avenue and West Executive Avenue). All sound amplification equipment shall be limited so that it will not unreasonably disturb nonparticipating persons in, or in the vicinity of, the area.
8. The National Park Service reserves the right to immediately revoke this permit at any time should it reasonably appear that the public gathering presents a clear and present danger to the public safety, good order or health, or if any conditions of this permit are violated

- A. Activity will consist of the annual U. S. Army Ten-Miler starting and ending at the Pentagon. See attached map for route and Fact Sheet. NPS jurisdiction will be used as a portion of the race course and for one water location.

Stated Number of Participants: 23,000 to 25,000

B. Time Schedule

4:30 am	Water trucks dispense water and park
5:00 am	Set-up: equipment to water stop & drop cones along course
7:15 am	NPS Road closures along course
7:50 am	Handicapped Race begins
8:00 am	Race begins
10:00 am	Cut off time (for participants who cannot maintain a 15 minute mile)
11:00 am	Race concludes
11:00 am	Road clean up

Water Stations/Portable restrooms: Permittee is responsible for providing water stations along the race course. Stations will be located at two-mile plus intervals. On NPS jurisdiction one water station will be located on the grassy area, along Rock Creek Parkway, grassy area, south of the Volleyball courts and one (1) on the north side of Constitution Avenue between 21st and 20th Streets.

Water Stations Set-up: forty (40) tables, trash boxes, and water

Support vehicles of water tanker and three-four (3-4) military 5 ton trucks will park on a side street of Constitution Avenue water stop and the Old Con turn around for Parkway Drive. Parking of any support vehicles cannot be on the sidewalks nor the grass.

Ten (10) portable restrooms will be located at each water stop. Restrooms cannot block the sidewalks.

- C. Bands: U. S. Army field bands or a high school band will be placed at each water stop. On NPS jurisdiction, at Mile 4 and Mile 6, one (1) military band will be set-up near Reservation #201, Baratholdi Fountain to entertain runners as they go by.
- D. Parking: All vehicles must park in designated, available public spaces. Parking on grass and on sidewalks is strictly prohibited. Parking for volunteers will be allowed on a space available bases allow Ohio Drive and Jefferson Drive in designated available public spaces.
- E. Trash Removal: Permittee is responsible for bagging and removing all trash and debris resulting from this permitted activity immediately following the conclusion of this activity on October 20, 2013. Clear plastic bags must be used to collect generated trash. Any cost incurred by the National Park Service as a result of trash removal will be borne by the permittee.

G. Signs & Commercial Advertising:

NPS regulations generally prohibit Federal parkland from being used for business solicitation or for the advertisement or promotion of commercial brands, products, and services. As such, no commercial notices and advertisements shall be placed, posted, or distributed at the event. Further, no structures representing commercial products, or models or replications of commercial products or merchandise may be displayed.

Further, consistent with long-standing NPS policy now under Public Law 108-108, Title I, § 145, special event permits will expressly prohibit the erection, placement, or use of structures and signs bearing commercial advertising. However, a permit may be issued that authorizes the recognition of sponsors of special events, if the NPS determines that the size and form of the recognition is consistent with the special nature and sanctity of the National Mall or any other requested park area, and if the lettering or design identifying the sponsor is no larger than one-third the size of the lettering or design identifying the special event. Further, to the maximum extent practicable for such special events, public use of and access to the National Mall and other parkland is not to be restricted.

The Permittee shall submit a sign plan for NPS review and approval. Any request seeking NPS approval for sponsor recognition must be submitted to the NPS at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed event, and be depicted on the sign plan. If approved by the NPS, sponsor recognition will be authorized within the terms of the special event permit. Authorized sponsor recognition must be in keeping with NPS policy, regulations, and law, and be appropriate to the scale and theme of the special event. Further, the overall size, number, and design of any signs or banners shall be appropriate to the park setting and the lettering or design identifying the sponsor must be no larger than one-third the

size of the lettering or design identifying the special event. Signs and banners may not be affixed to existing trees or other NPS facilities or structures.

Soliciting personal information such as names, addresses, telephone numbers, zip codes, etc., or any other such information which may be used for future solicitation or marketing purposes, is strictly prohibited.

The distribution or give-away of a commercial product may be allowed, if it is something that may be consumed at the event site such as pre-packaged juices or popcorn.

H. First Aid:

Permittee is responsible for providing first aid services, including transport services, along the race course. Medical will be located each ½ mile interval with 45 marshalls located along the route. Medical techs should have AEDs with them.

Permittee will be responsible for providing first aid service onsite at each permitted location. It is recommended that you consider the guidelines of the District of Columbia Department of Emergency Medical Services, who recommends for large-scale events that involve between 20,000-30,000 participants, that organizers have (1) a fixed First Aid site with certified/licensed personnel who will remain on-site throughout the event (2) a licensed Basic Life Support Ambulance and (3) a Licensed Advanced Life Support Unit (both licensed in the District of Columbia).

- I. Unbudgeted Expenditures: Any unbudgeted expenditures incurred by the National Park Service and/or United States Park Police as a result of this activity will be borne by the permittee. Unbudgeted expenditures include but not limited to personnel services to staff the event as well as maintenance supplies and materials. U. S. Park Police and National Park Service personnel will be assigned to this activity. Permittee is responsible for reimbursing the U. S. Park Police for all personnel overtime costs associated with this activity.
- J. Filming: Permission is granted to film activity for documentary files. Crew with camera on tripod and/or hand held will be positioned in the grassy area behind the Lincoln Memorial facing Memorial Bridge and near mile #7. In addition one crew will be in a pace vehicle, motorcycle, filming race. All equipment must be portable and self contained with all stands using rubber tips or matting to protect the surface. All equipment must be hand carried / hand carted to filming site.
- K. Cabling: All cables must be covered with matting or placed in “yellow jackets” to prevent tripping hazards.
- L. Additional Permits: Permittee is responsible for obtaining the necessary clearances and/or permits from Arlington County Police, Virginia State Police, U. S. Capitol Police and the Metropolitan Police Department for those portions of this activity which fall within each respective jurisdiction.

M. Lead/Tail Vehicles and Closure at 14th : The race will be led by police motorcycles, a police cruiser, a press flatbed truck and a motorcycle with a side car attached for filming. The last runner will be followed by the pick-up bus, a trash pick up truck police vehicle and a MP vehicle. At approximately 9:15 am, runners have not reached 14th Street and Independence Avenue, the roadway will be closed and runners will be directed to cross the 14th Street bridge or placed on the tail bus.

N. Hold Harmless Agreement:

The permittee hereby agrees to save and hold harmless the United States of America, its agents and employees, from any claims, damages, suits at law or equity of whatsoever kind of nature for damages to or loss of property or death to persons resulting directly or indirectly from or attributable to the the permittee, its participants, service providers or its employee in connection with this event authorized by this permit.

The permittee will be responsible for any injuries and/or damage to government property occurring as a result of this permitted activity.

O. Additional Conditions

1. Permittee is responsible for providing all necessary equipment/objects to conduct this activity. All equipment must be removed from the park immediately following the conclusion of the event on October 20, 2013. Items left in the park will be considered abandoned property and will not be the responsibility of the National Park Service.
2. The alternation, adaptation, damage or injuring, and/or removal of park resources or facilities is prohibited.
3. No attachments to trees, plantings, benches, lamp posts, facilities, etc.
4. Balloons, glass beverage containers and alcoholic beverages are prohibited on parkland.
5. The permittee will be responsible for any injuries and/or damage to government property occurring as a result of this permitted activity.
6. A copy of this permit must be carried at all times by the permittee while operating under the authority granted.
7. Coordination for this activity will continue through Sgt. Ari Wong, United States Park Police, 202-610-7092 and Robbin Owen, Division of Permits Management, 202-245-4715.

Hi All,

This will be the group I communicate with to give heads up about events that are of significance and need guidance on resolving that will likely rise to the level of the Secretary for resolution if we can't successfully manage them. If you would like me to add others, just let me know. This is in response to the Secretary wanting early notice on these types of situations.

1. Bridge Days at New River Gorge: scheduled for October 18 and 19. The event is annual and draws about 125,000 participants/spectators. They jump from the state owned bridge and land in the water or land of the NPS. Normally we would issue a permit to the group. Due to shutdown we will revoke the permit. But this group is going ahead with their activity on the planned dates and we see no way to prevent it from happening. Park/Region/NPS preferred option to deal with this is to have limited staff on hand to deal with the most serious of issues only. This would mean bringing on more law enforcement rangers than currently on duty. Normally we would have 40 staff on duty for the event. Best thinking today is trying to manage with 15. Park currently has 7 commissioned rangers on duty so we would bring on 8 additional rangers into excepted status for the duration of the event.

2. Army Ten Miler Race at National Mall and Memorial Parks: scheduled for October 20 on roadways in NAMA, GWMP and ROCR requiring permit staff and USPP for set up of road closures, siting of first aid/water stations, spectator areas. Annual event and the permit had been issued prior to shutdown and now the organizers have been notified the permit is cancelled because of shutdown. Suggested organizers find alternative route. We believe the Secretary should expect a call from a pentagon/army official to ask her assistance in reinstating their permit. NPS believes our activities for this race are not consistent with protection of life, health safety that is the focus of our work during shutdown and believe cancelling this permit is the best course of action.

As you know, the Bowfin Submarine Museum has been shutdown since October 1st due to the Park Service's decision to not allow access across the Arizona parking lot or via the service road. Below is the text of a letter I sent to you earlier today with the details. A copy of the letter is also attached.

As I mention in the letter, I am available to discuss this issue whenever convenient to you.

Text of letter:

I want to ensure you are aware of the ramifications of the government shutdown, and the National Park Service interpretation of the shutdown, are having on non-governmental entities here in Hawai'i.

As you know, the Arizona Memorial is closed. The normal access to the USS

Bowfin Submarine and Museum is through the Arizona, so the Bowfin has also been closed since October 1st. The Bowfin is not on National Park Service land, but all access is across National Park Service property.

We have discussed this issue with National Park Service leadership locally and requested permission to allow Bowfin visitors to cross the closed Arizona parking lot or to walk down the service road that is used for the Missouri and Aviation Museum buses. The visitors would not have access to the Arizona Memorial, just the parking lot or the service road. We offered to provide additional security to ensure the visitors only visited Bowfin. The response from Arizona management has been no; no access through the parking lot and no access down the service road.

Bowfin is a small and close-knit organization. We value our crewmembers very much, and try to take care of them. So, Bowfin leadership and the board of directors opted to retain the entire organization on payroll for two weeks in anticipation of a short government shutdown. Unfortunately, Bowfin cannot continue paying payroll and fixed costs indefinitely without any revenues. Therefore, on Monday October 14th we will furlough the majority of our workforce. This will mean 50+ more people in Hawai'i will be without jobs until the end of the shutdown, or until the National Park Service allows us enough access to open our operations. Additionally, these furloughs will be different than the furloughs of Federal employees, as there will likely not be any back pay when the furloughs are ended.

The Missouri and the Pacific Aviation Museum have been able to continue operations throughout the shutdown. With the concurrence of the Navy, they have moved their bus loading point off of your property to the Navy property across the street. But Bowfin is shutdown because the National Park Service states they cannot allow any access during the shutdown, even if there are no requirements for Park Service personnel and all expenses are paid by Bowfin.

We will continue to urge the Administration and our Congressional delegation to try to come to a resolution of this shutdown as soon as possible. In the meantime, we request the National Park Service to consider some flexibility in the interpretation of the shutdown directives, and negotiate a resolution with us regarding access that will allow Bowfin to operate and save our crewmembers' jobs.

Greetings to all. I want to pass along the latest update which John and I received. The following was passed along by our Joint Interagency Program Director (Arnaldo "Arnie" Claudio) yesterday. The position of USPP/USPS according to Deputy Chief Robert McLean USPP. The USPP personnel by federal law during the shutdown cannot monitor the intersection for the roads that run through the NPS jurisdictions.

Now, at his suggestion this leaves open the door with proper coordination between DCMPD, ACPD, and VSP that the streets can be covered by another jurisdiction. We are looking at up on Memorial Drive, Memorial Bridge and across to 23rd Street and along Constitution Ave (23rd Street to 18th St), Rock Creek Parkway by the Kennedy Center and around to Independence Ave., and then Independence Ave up to 14th St. This could be up to 4 miles of the race route.

This option if possible would save all around in planning of trying to locate an alternate course. I for one like some excitement but at times when the dog is sleep leave it along. It might wake up hungry.

Hey Greg,

Thanks so much for following up. We definitely don't want to make any enemies with the National Park Services or the City or with any of you. We have had such a great relationship working together for the benefit of our community.

With that said, our Girlfriends Half Marathon is being negatively affected by the government shut down. We have been granted access to the land-bridge b/c it is run by the city. However, our course does run through the Fort from the Land-bridge to 5th and then through the park on the roadway. The trails are still accessible and people have been using them since the government shutdown – we have been monitoring the trails closely and have seen people using them.

To re-route our course would require huge logistical adjustments which we just don't have the time or desire to tackle. We would have to reroute under the Highway 14 underpass and marshal the on and off ramps and get WSDOT involved, change all the mileage markers, adjust the course volunteer stations, re-do officer marshal assignments, and course set up management sheet – a 14 page document with all details outlined for course set up. We have already met with all involved course marshals, Officer Reserves, volunteers, course set up crew and sent out correspondence to all volunteers. We are now into final details for our event and to go back to the drawing board on all of these logistics would be a complete nightmare!

So based on conversations with my team and other community leaders, we have decided to stay the route. Brenda Braxton is running the event and we are all prepared to get press involved in the event that anyone tries to stop us. ☺

SAN JUAN COUNTY — Several leaders of San Juan County said they're going to move the barricades implemented by the government shutdown and let people back onto Lake Powell.

Commissioner Phil Lyman posted information about his plan on his Facebook page Monday.

"The plan is to peacefully remove the barriers to places like Lake Powell, Natural Bridges, Canyonlands and Hovenweep and allow visitors to enjoy their places," Lyman wrote. "We are not going to sit idle while the Federal Government destroys the local economy! They are spending more money to keep people out than it would cost to let people in."

Lyman met with several other county commissioners to discuss and work out their plan.

"We're talking about natural bridges, national monument," Lyman said. "There's a barricade across the road, prevents people from driving around the loop. They can hike down to them. It seems silly for the federal government.

"It doesn't sit well with me to say that's the federal government and there's nothing we can do about it. We're actually a government as well. For a county that has only 8 percent private land, we rely a lot on the public land for our economy.

"This is not anarchy. This is government doing what government does which is look after the health and welfare and safety of their citizens. And as a county commissioner, I made a promise to do that for my citizens."

Commissioner Lyman said they were hoping to have their plan set to open up roads by Tuesday, but it might be later in the week.

He said several other counties and the sheriff's of those counties are all in on the plan.

Due to several conversations over the day, we seem to have reached a mutually positive position with the State of South Dakota about Mount Rushmore:

- They appreciated our security posture, and the small adjustments in operations to ensure health life and safety, which allow the pullouts to be used by travelers on Hwy 244.
- We discussed two levels of signage: the first, along the hwy on the approach into the park. The State has posted variable message signs and we are working with them on mutually agreeable language.
- The second level is all NPS: these signs are in the park at the main entrance to the visitor facility area, and along the boundary of the pullout area, etc, and will consist of the NPS template shutdown/closed signs.
- Our main contact is the Governor's Security Advisor, Matt Konenkamp; he has agreed to continue working with me and the park. While he disagrees with us on the States authority for the pullouts (and wants to seek concurrent jurisdiction for the entire park so that next time, they can keep it open); I did get him to agree that we would work on a clearer MOU for state & NPS authorities along the road, AFTER the shutdown ends.
- The Governor himself said it best when he called Chief Ranger Don Hart--thanking the NPS employees for what they do; knowing we are in a tough position; and appreciating our continued working relationship during this tough time.

Patty and I did make contact with one reporter and provided an update to the situation. (Patty R can send notes tomorrow).

Sarah: My understanding of the 1995-96 situation was that agreement with Arizona and a few other places was reached and signed, money transferred and deposited but before it could be expended, the shut down ended. As a peace offering to the Governor of Arizona, the Superintendent re-opened the closed road to Mather Point at the Canyon, but not anything else. The re-opening of this road was done without the use of the State funds, but the perception by the public is that we took the money and opened the grand canyon. Our records indicate we returned the funds to the state since they were never used. This version has been confirmed by a number of people, all of whom have bad memories.
