St. John School Land Exchange

Briefing Paper for the Senior Plenary Session of the Interagency Group on Insular Areas March 1, 2011

BACKGROUND:

- The National Park Service owns about two-thirds of the sum 20 square miles that make up St. John, the smallest of the three major islands constituting the Virgin Islands. Various VI governors, delegates, and the community at large have been petitioning Congress and DOI to support some form of land transfer from the St. John NPS property to the GVI to build a vitally needed school on St. John.
- The elementary schools in St. John are in great disrepair and one is in the middle of dangerous commercial area where one student has already been killed while attempting to cross the street. All high school age children must also travel daily to St. Thomas to attend school because there are no secondary schools on St. John.
- GVI does not have the appropriate land holdings to relocate or build a new school, and the cost of purchasing land at market rate on St. John would make the project cost prohibitive.
- After many years of advocacy, the VI won the support of several members of Congress to swap St. John NPS land for Estate Grange in St. Croix (land associated with Alexander Hamilton) to build a school in St. John. Secretary Salazar has directed OIA and NPS to work with GVI to facilitate the transfer.
- OIA provided GVI with a grant of \$200,000 in the last quarter of 2008 to fund the required studies necessary to pass NPS standards to establish that the proposed site for a school on St. John did not possess any significant historic or cultural assets.

Current Status:

• NPS waiting on GVI to call a meeting to finalize terms so that a special use permit can be issued to allow GVI contractor to begin studies of establishing appropriateness for proposed land in Estate Cathernineberg.
