The U.S. Department of the Interior's International Technical Assistance Program (DOI-ITAP) collaborates with other countries by:

- Facilitating exchanges between DOI's technical experts and international counterparts,
- Forging government-to-government working relationships, and
- Engaging private-sector implementing partners.

DOI-ITAP supports DOI and U.S. foreign policy priorities in over 60 countries with funding from the U.S. Agency for International Development and the U.S. Department of State.

DOI is the cabinet-level agency responsible for the conservation and sustainable use of the Nation's natural resources and cultural heritage. DOI relies on its 70,000 employees to manage the 500 million acres of land and 1.7 billion acres of the outer continental shelf under its jurisdiction.

Each year, DOI:

- Welcomes more than 550 million visitors to natural, cultural and recreational sites;
- Generates 2.3 million jobs; and
- Contributes over \$350 billion to the U.S. economy.

DOI-ITAP fields interdisciplinary teams from across DOI's technical bureaus and offices, including:



National Park Service

- Manages 400+ protected areas
- Tourism services to 400+ million visitors/year



U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

- Manages habitats for migratory species
- Monitors and protects endangered species



Bureau of Land Management

- Oversees public lands for multiple uses
- Regulates extraction of minerals, oil & gas



Bureau of Indian Affairs

- Promotes self-determination for tribes
- Supports wise management of tribal resources



U.S. Geological Survey

- World-class scientific research
- Analyzes and reduces natural hazards impacts



Office of Surface Mining, Reclamation and Enforcement

- Regulates coal mining industry
- Reclaims abandoned mine lands



Bureau of Safety & Environmental Enforcement

 Enforces environmental and safety regulations for offshore oil & gas operations



Bureau of Reclamation

- Largest supplier of water in the western U.S.
- Manages hydroelectric dams and energy
- production



Office of Natural Resources Revenue

 Collects and accounts for revenues from Federal mineral and oil & gas leases



Bureau of Ocean Energy Management

 Manages leases for offshore conventional and renewable energy
