FEDERAL SUBSISTENCE SEASON FOR GOATS CLOSED IN A PORTION OF UNIT 5A

EXPLANATION:

This Special Action closes the 2019 Federal subsistence mountain goat season in a portion of Unit 5A. The closed area begins on the west shore of Harlequin Lake and the western edge of Yakutat Glacier; then west of Harlequin Lake and Yakutat Glacier to Yakutat Bay and Disenchantment Bay; and south of Russell and Nunatak Fjords. The closure is effective through 01/31/2020. The Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) has established a closure of the State season for the same area (Emergency Order 01-01-19).

REGULATION: 36 CFR §242.26(n)(5) and 50 CFR §100.26(n)(5) are amended to read:

Unit 5A – Mountain Goat

Unit 5A—that area between the Hubbard Glacier and the West Nunatak Glacier on the north and east sides of Nunatak Fjord

No open season

Unit 5A - the area beginning on the west shore of Harlequin Lake and the western edge of Yakutat Glacier, then west of Harlequin Lake and Yakutat Glacier to Yakutat Bay and Disenchantment Bay, and south of Russell and Nunatak Fjords. I goat by Federal registration permit. The harvest quota will be announced prior to the season. A minimum of four goats in the harvest quota will be reserved for federally qualified subsistence users

Aug. 1 - Jan. 31 Closed

Unit 5A, remainder —1 goat by Federal registration permit. The harvest quota will be announced prior to the season. A minimum of four goats in the harvest quota will be reserved for federally qualified subsistence users

Aug. 1 - Jan. 31

Unit 5B—1 goat by Federal registration permit only

JUSTIFICATION:

Aerial surveys conducted between 2006 and 2016 in this area indicate a significant decline in goat numbers. The following are survey results by year: 2006, 122 goats (minimum estimate, partial survey only); 2007, 66 goats; 2008, 57 goats; 2009, 48 goats; 2010, 12 goats; 2011, 38 goats; and 2016, 19 goats. The consistently low number of goats detected suggests the areas' goat population remains depressed. The federal subsistence season has remained open in recent years to allow continued subsistence harvest opportunities. No goats had been harvested in this area in recent years; however, in October 2018, one female was harvested by a subsistence user. Any additional harvest of goats in this area could have long term negative effects on the health and recovery of this population.

A public hearing to discuss the goat management in Unit 5 was held on July 9, 2019 in Yakutat, Alaska. The one member of the public who attended was supportive of conserving mountain goats in the Yakutat area through closure of a portion of Unit 5.

State and federal managers intend to survey the population in fall of 2019 in order to obtain updated information; however, given the best available data and the recent harvest of a female, managers consider it necessary to close the season for conservation concerns.
