**2015 Yukon River Fall Salmon Fishery News Release # 9
Fall Announcement # 9, Yukon River District 1 Commercial Period 3**
Districts Affected: Lower Yukon Area

The 2015 fall chum salmon pre-season run projection, based on the summer chum to fall chum salmon relationship, is for a run size between 700,000 and 800,000 fish. This level of abundance should be sufficient to provide for escapement, an above average subsistence harvest, and a surplus available for commercial and personal use purposes.

The estimated passage of fall chum salmon having passed the mainstem sonar near Pilot Station through July 25 is 137,000, which is above the historical median of 77,500 fish for that date. The first pulse of fall chum salmon entered the Yukon River on July 17 and finished passing the mainstem sonar on July 22. The size of the 1st pulse was approximately 117,000 fish in size.

District 1 Commercial Schedule:

Commercial fishing will be open for one period in District 1, including the **Set Net Only Area**, on Monday, July 27 from 7:00 p.m. until 1:00 a.m. Tuesday, July 28. This will be a 6-hour commercial fishing period with gillnets restricted to six-inch or smaller mesh size.

The sale of Chinook salmon is prohibited. Therefore, commercial gillnet fishermen can release live Chinook salmon or use them for subsistence purposes. Chinook salmon retained from commercial gillnet gear must be recorded on a fish ticket as retained but not sold.

Preliminary reports from the District Y-1 commercial opening on July 23 indicate a harvest of 4,047 fall chum and 184 coho salmon from 68 permit holders. The preliminary cumulative commercial fall chum harvest for District Y-1 is 7,745 fall chum salmon and 231 coho salmon.

District 1 Subsistence Fishing Schedule:

Subsistence salmon fishing in District 1 is open during the fall season 7 days per week, 24 hours per day with gillnets restricted to a maximum mesh size of 7.5 inches, except for 12 hours before, during, and 12 hours after each commercial fishing period. In District 1, subsistence salmon fishing will close at 7:00 a.m. Monday, July 27, and reopen at 1:00 p.m. Tuesday, July 28.

Fishermen may use 4-inch or smaller mesh size gillnets not exceeding 60 feet in length to target non-salmon species during subsistence salmon closures.
